A Furness Playgroup is to benefit from a safety project on a construction site at Sellafield.

A wish-list of equipment will be presented to Lindal Playgroup after it was nominated by construction worker John Wicks.

Items including a Wendy House and musical instruments, will be presented to the playgroup, which caters for children up to the age of five.

Mr Wicks, who lives in Lindal, is the laterst worker on the BTC site at Sellafield to be asked to name an organisation under the Cracked It safety scheme.

Under the scheme, every 28 days, without a recordable accident, management make a donation to a local cause, nominated by one of their workers.

Builders on the BTC site have now gone more than 250 days without a major accident, helping nine good causes in Cumbria.

Any worker can nominate a school, organisation or individual for a donation and the site's safety representatives decide which is the most worthy.
